Most Sections meet once a month during the academic year and provide opportunities for learning and creative self-expression. Please pay Section Club dues before signing up for activity Sections.

Birding: Outings to different habitats in the Bay Area. No birding experience needed, just an appreciation of the outdoors.

Bon Appétit: Members enjoy dining together for themed dinners on dates to be determined.

Book Discussion: One member leads the discussion of a chosen book. No need to read the whole book to participate.

Drama: Actors and audience are welcome. With just one

rehearsal, members put on a play.

French, German, Italian: Each Section enjoys a planned program and lunch or refreshments. Conversation in each language is practiced.

Japanese Tea Ceremony: Participate in a five centuries old practice with a focus on mindfulness. Days and times vary. **Movies:** Each month watch a chosen movie independently and then gather at the home of a member to discuss it.

Music: Talented musicians perform for the members, followed by refreshments. A **chorus** meets weekly under the direction of a fine conductor.

Newcomers: New members learn about the mission of the club, its events, Sections, and philanthropic activities. **Pickleball:** Once a week players meet at the Cedar/Rose pickleball courts. Players include those of many levels, from beginners to regulars.

Sew & So: Members meet together to work on individual projects while enjoying the camaraderie of the group.

Tennis: Men and women meet daily for doubles.

UC Berkeley Art Museum: Docent-led tours of exhibits. Occasional presentations at the Berkeley Film Archive.

Walking: Once a month participants walk on easy or moderate trails.

Writers' Workshop: A support group for those who like to write. Members read and give comments on works in-progress. There is a non-fiction subgroup.

Philanthropy

Since 1927, the University Section Club has encouraged a sense of community on the Berkeley campus, welcoming newcomers and reaching across departmental boundaries from all corners of the university. It has been a catalyst for friendship, service and philanthropy. The University Section Club, Inc., is a registered, nonprofit organization with the State of California. Through generous donations and fundraising, 100% of all funds support UCB students and scholars through our philanthropic programs. Our members are welcome to volunteer to be a part of our mission to help students in need.

Student Grants. Student Grants are awarded on merit – acceptable GPA required. Grants are given to undergraduate and graduate students (referred by campus unit staff) who are near graduation and are experiencing an unanticipated, non-recurring medical, financial or other emergency. Grants are awarded to students in an amount up to \$1,500 as needed. The purpose of the grant is to alleviate financial distress and allow completion of the student's studies without disruption.

Services Offered Students (S.O.S.). S.O.S. manages the Sylvia Elberg Memorial Fund, providing emergency grants to students (referred by campus unit staff) of up to \$1,000 as needed. Each student being referred is experiencing an unanticipated, non-recurring medical, financial or other emergency. The S.O.S Fund for Projects or Equipment provides funds for student related projects or equipment proposed by campus unit staff. It is hoped that in most instances our program awards will act as seed money to stimulate permanent funding by the university or other funding sources.

Endowments: The University Section Club supports two endowments: 1) The **Undergraduate Scholarships Endowment** supports need-based undergraduate scholarships. 2) The **Endowment for I-House Graduate Students** helps one or two graduate students with room and board at I-House.

Jubilee Brunch

At the Jubilee Brunch in early May at the Bancroft Hotel, the Section Club honored Chancellor Carol T. Christ for her years of excellent service to the university community. Chancellor Christ gave a moving speech, sharing some of the challenges she had faced, such as the COVID years, People's Park and the lack of student housing. The event also celebrated the philanthropic arm of the Section Club for having reached the "million dollar mark". Over the last four decades the Section Club has bestowed hundreds of emergency grants to students and funded student group projects; it has also established the two endowments, mentioned on a previous page, which benefit students and it has funded over \$50,000 toward the construction of the Section Club Room at the University's Tang Center. Collectively more than \$1,000,000 in gifts has been given.
